





Part One Crime Comparison 2003–2013




Breakdown of Part I Offenses



2012– 2013 Violent Crime




2012-2013 Property Crime

Crime Scene Investigations



- ▶ Closed 24 cases in 2013 by latent identifications
- ▶ 54 identifications of crime scene prints
- ▶ Suspect identification leads to quicker arrests
- ▶ Valuable investigative time saved
- ▶ Reduction in property crimes

- ▶ 250 students





Offender Focused Domestic Violence Initiative

- ▶ Partnering with High Point Police Department to replicate their model for reducing Domestic Violence
- ▶ Identify Chronic Domestic Violence Offenders
- ▶ Partnership with District Attorney, Family Services, Court Officials, NC Probation Parole, & Davidson County Coalition Against Violence
- ▶ Hold the offender accountable, empower the victim
- ▶ We average 1,500 domestic calls per year
- ▶ This initiative should allow us to reduce incidents of domestic violence as well as protect victims
